

Happy 2025 from the Jamestown Fine Arts Association!

What an exciting year ahead for us! We're thrilled to see significant progress on our capital campaign, "Raising the Bar for the Arts." While the project has come in a bit higher than we initially anticipated, the JFAA Board of Directors and our dedicated capital campaign committee are fully committed to raising the necessary funds to complete it by September 2025.

Construction Begins

We are excited to offer culinary classes to the community, and the commercial-grade kitchen can be rented for cottage farmers who want to sell their food products.

Cyanotype is a slow-reacting, photographic printing formulation sensitive to a limited near ultraviolet and blue light spectrum. In short, they're small photographs made using sunlight! In collaboration with the Bison Museum, JFAA will conduct a cyanotype workshop to help creatively identify the local plant species Bison need to survive. Projects created at this session could be on display for locals and tourists alike.






