The Rourke Art Gallery + Museum is pleased to present Artist + Muse: woodcuts by Charles Beck from the Timothy Murphy Collection, a touring exhibition of woodcut prints by the late artist Charles Beck (1923 - 2017) from the collection of the late poet Timothy Murphy (1951 - 2018).

Murphy was an admirer and friend of Beck and derived both enjoyment and inspiration from his friend's artwork. Murphy's poem "Snowgeese" references and gives direct attribution to Beck's iconic landscape of the same name:

Snowgeese for Charles Beck

The flock is whorled like a translucent shell and intricate as the tubing of a horn, its embouchure, the soft foot of a snail lighting on sand, except the sand is corn, chisel ploughed and left to build the soil from which indebted farmers have been torn.

I catch one note—a wild, wayfaring cry as snow geese splash into a glacial mere. Framed by moraines under a nacreous sky, they echo in the chambers of my ear. How does an ear rival your artist's eye that sees what I can only hope to hear?

Reproduced images of Beck woodcuts are also featured in most of Murphy's published collections of poetry. This exhibition comprises 24 Beck woodcuts and 6 Murphy poems on panel.

She continues to encourage organizations to use "arts" to shape dialogue, generate community development, create social engagement and enhance teaching methods.

In 2021, Jeppson moved from the prairies of North Dakota to the mountains of Oregon. It is with great excitement that Sally returns to Jamestown to jury the 60th Annual JFAA Art Show. Having coordinated the exhibit, selected the jurors and installed the exhibit for 21 years she is delighted to be "on the other side" of this important community and regional exhibit-one of the longest continuously running annuals in North Dakota. During her many years working on the JFAA Annual she was always amazed at the diversity and quality of the submissions. The great variety of art created by professional artists, amateurs and youth always posed an installation challenge and Sally is so happy Anna now gets that part of the job! Jeppson is looking forward to jurying the show and encountering artists new to the exhibit as well as many familiar artists. She hopes for lots of submissions to commemorate The Arts Center's 60 years supporting arts, artists and arts education in North Dakota.

6x6: A Celebration of 60 Years of Creativity

Join us in celebrating The Arts Center's (JFAA) 60th year with "6x6: A Celebration of 60 Years of Creativity." This special exhibition highlights the diverse talent of artists from our community and beyond. Each artwork, measuring 6

inches by 6 inches, offers a unique glimpse into the creative narrative, spanning paintings, drawings, sculptures, and mixed media. Since its inception six decades ago, The Arts Center has been a cornerstone of artistic innovation and cultural enrichment. As we commemorate this milestone and reflect on our journey, "6x6" underscores the enduring influence of art on our lives and communities. We invite you to join us in honoring this significant anniversary.

Theme:

"6x6" embraces an open theme, encouraging interpretations that resonate with a wide audience, including school-age children. While reflecting on the passage of time, celebrating milestones, or envisioning the future are suggested themes, artists are welcome to explore any subject matter within appropriate boundaries. The Arts Center (JFAA) retains the right to remove artwork with overtly offensive or explicit themes, which will be returned to the artist at their expense.

Community Engagement:

The Arts Center fosters inclusivity by inviting artists of all ages and backgrounds to participate in "6x6." This exhibition provides a platform for both emerging and established artists, highlighting the capacity of art to inspire, provoke thought, and stimulate dialogue within the community.

Materials:


Artworks may encompass painting, printmaking, drawing, mixed media, and sculpture. All submissions must be unframed and dry, with three-dimensional pieces constrained within a 6"x6"x6" cube. Artwork should not extend beyond the 6"x6" border, and any offensive content will result in return to the artist at their own expense.

Commission/Entry Fee:

No entry fee is required, and each artist may contribute one artwork. Donations can be allocated as 100%, 50/50%, or 70 (artist)/30% (arts center). ONLY youth artists can NO SALE (NFS) their artwork.

On-line Auction:

Artworks will be auctioned on-line with starting bids set at approximately 35% of the retail price. Buyers will have the option of purchasing artwork immediately at a higher price than the retail value. The on-line auction will run for the first two weeks of the show. Unsold artworks can either be donated to the Arts Center or collected by the artist at their expense at the end of the show. The Arts Center (JFAA) will not cover shipping costs related to artwork. Materials Available for Purchase:

The Arts Center (JFAA) offers materials for creating artworks, including 6"x6" Blick Academic Cotton Stretched Canvas and 6"x6" Arches Natural White Watercolor Paper (both cold and hot press). These materials are available for purchase at \$10 each, with shipping available for an additional \$10. Materials are provided free of charge to individuals in 12th grade or younger, but shipping is not included.


